

Dragon Slayer

A member of Sedgefield Harriers has completed an event that is billed as the 'world's toughest mountain race'.

On Monday 4 September, Gary Thwaites toed the line at the start of the Montane Dragon's Back Race, a six-day, 380km race along the mountainous spine of Wales. Starting in Conwy Castle, participants had to try and complete an ultra-marathon on six consecutive days, including a total of 17,400m of climbing (twice the height of Everest), and finishing in Cardiff Castle. On the way, they went to the summits of many iconic mountains, including Tryfan, Yr Wyddfa (Snowdon), Cnicht, the Rhinogydd, Cadair Idris, the Black Mountain, and the peaks of the Brecon Beacons.

Every day, runners in the Dragon's Back Race had to cover an average of over 60km and reach checkpoints before a scheduled time or they were cut out of the event, all while carrying a list of mandatory kit, water and food as they move. There is always a high rate of attrition and this year, the hot weather

throughout the week had a big impact. Of the 298 runners from 25 nations who started the event, only 87 completed it. Gary not only achieved that, but also finished 16th overall and was first in the V50 age category. Over the six days, he was running for a total of 66 hours, 54 minutes and 20 seconds. Gary can now claim to be a 'Dragon Slayer'. It's a remarkable achievement for anyone to complete the race. Congratulations to Gary. Sedgefield Memory Café

The chair of Durham County Council has highlighted and praised the work of a local community group that supports people living with dementia. Cllr Joan Nicholson attended Sedgefield Memory Café to meet with clients and volunteers, and with local county councillors David Brown and Chris Lines. Cllr Nicholson had been invited by the team that runs the café after they learned that she is fundraising for the Alzheimer's Society during her civic year.

Sedgefield Memory Café is held every month in Sedgefield Methodist Church Hall and is open to residents living with dementia and their carers. There are over 100 different types of dementia, one of which is Alzheimer's. The café is run by volunteers from the community, led by Dorothy Anderson and Carol Briggs. Each month, the team puts on different activities for clients, and also organises day trips during the year.

During her visit, Cllr Nicholson and her consort Mr Rob Nicholson were welcomed by Carol, who introduced them to the rest of the team and some of the regular attendees. Along with Cllrs Brown and Lines, Cllr Nicholson took part in the morning's activities and discussed future plans for the café with the volunteers. Cllr Joan Nicholson comments: "It was a privilege to meet everyone at Sedgefield Memory Café. Community initiatives like this play an absolutely vital role in dealing with the day to day impact of dementia. They offer amazing local support and it was clear that everyone who visits the café values that hugely. This is so important alongside the wider work that the Alzheimer's Society does to offer support to those living with dementia, and also fund medical research into life-changing treatments.'

Carol Briggs adds: "Joan got really involved in the morning and spent a lot of time chatting to our clients. I enjoyed talking with her about the work that she is doing to support the Alzheimer's Society, and give her an insight into how we make a difference here in Sedgefield. Hopefully Cllr Nicholson's visit will raise awareness of our café, help with our fundraising, and encourage those who are living with dementia to join us each time we open. STEVE'S NATURE DIARY OCTOBER 2023

October is quite often seen as a changeover month when the last of the migrant birds like Swallows and House Martins are on the way south and winter visitors such as Redwing, Fieldfare and various wildfowl and waders arrive from the north. If it is sunny, you may still see the last of the butterflies, Red Admiral and Comma feeding on windfall apples. Talking of butterflies, you may remember in the August nature notes I mentioned the Big Butterfly Count. As I write this article, Butterfly Conservation have just announced the results. I hope you joined the other 95,000 citizen scientists who took part conducting 136,719 15-minute counts in gardens, parks, school grounds and the countryside. Overall, participants of the Big Butterfly Count enjoyed seeing more butterflies this year than in the previous four summers. Did you? I am not sure I did! In total, over 1.5 million butterflies and day-flying moths were recorded from 14 July - 6 August. After an all-time low in 2022 of just nine individual butterflies spotted per count, this year saw an increase to 12 butterflies recorded on average per count.

However, this good news is in contrast with what the long-term trends are revealing. Released for the first time this year, these show that since the Big Butterfly Count started 13 years ago, many species numbers have significantly decreased.

It is a further warning sign that nature everywhere is in crisis – butterflies, as well as forming a vital part of the food chain, are considered significant indicators of the health of the environment.

Butterfly Conservation think that the mixed weather this year helped because there has been an abundance of green food plants available for caterpillars, and plenty of nectar-rich flowers for adult butterflies. However, while the number of butterflies recorded this summer has been the highest since 2019, the longer-term trends show worrying declines for some of the UK's most common butterfly species. The most-seen species this year was the Red Admiral, with 248,077 recorded - an increase of 338% on last year's count and the first time the species, which is increasing in the UK as a result of climate change, has taken the top-spot. Species that saw a decline from last year include Ringlet, Common Blue and Speckled Wood, all of which also show long -term declines.

Dr Richard Fox, Head of Science at Butterfly Conservation, said: "One of the biggest threats butterflies in the UK face is habitat loss. While the weather certainly has an impact on numbers from year to year, butterflies, moths and many other species can generally cope with variable weather. What they can't cope with is habitat destruction. Butterflies need a place to live. If they can feed, breed and shelter, they can thrive. By creating a Wild Space in your

outdoor area, you can help to reverse the massive losses of wildlife-friendly habitat and start to turn around the fortunes of our declining butterflies." If you visit Butterfly Conservation website (butterfly-conservation.org), they have lots of ideas how you can improve your garden for wildlife especially butterflies.

SEDGEFIELD NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

NHW Coffee Morning

On Friday 1 September we held a very successful NHW coffee morning in Sedgefield Parish Hall. A huge thank you to all our members and friends who helped put on this event, providing lots of delicious cakes, scones and other yummy treats and donating numerous raffle prizes. Those attending included our mayor, Councillor Dave Jasper, Durham Police and Crime Commissioner Joy Allen, Sedgefield police officer P.C. Stephen Ward and both county and town councillors. A packed gathering listened with interest to a brief talk from Joy Allen, regarding local policing issues and how the proportion of our council tax, the police precept, goes towards increasing the funding available for local police staffing and equipment. A show of hands resulted in a majority of those present showing they were in favour of an increase in the precept, if it were to be proposed in the future, should it lead to more uniforms on the street in our area. The funds raised at the coffee morning will be used to purchase more safety and security equipment and to spread the word of how your Neighbourhood Watch helps to keep Sedgefield safe.

Street Cams

Another issue raised at the coffee morning was the possibility of obtaining funding, and the relevant permissions and support, to provide street cameras for Sedgefield. These are moveable cameras which can be placed on lamp posts wherever there is perceived to be a problem with antisocial behaviour or other issues in the area. The footage obtained may then be used to evidence an issue with local police or the council, thereby helping to alleviate the problem. This type of device has been used very successfully in the Newton Aycliffe area and could be used here to boost our current CCTV coverage.

Local Burglary

A recent night-time burglary in the Orchard area of Sedgefield is an unwanted but timely reminder to check up on our property security measures.

- 1. Ensure doors and windows are locked and secure.
- 2. Check that valuables are not visible from the street.
- 3. Install a "Dawn till Dusk" light, PIR light or a light timer linked to a small interior lamp.
- 4. Check security of sheds, garages and gates.

If you see or hear suspicious activity around your property, report it to the police immediately.

Sedgefield Teenagers Shelter

This shelter, located in front of our local council offices, continues to raise concerns, in the form of antisocial behaviour and litter issues. After numerous mentions on local social media platforms, this matter is well known to our local council and I am assured that measures are under consideration to resolve the problems.


Next NHW Meeting



As Gary was making his way home from Wales, numerous Harriers and other folk from Sedgefield were taking part in the annual pilgrimage from Newcastle to South Shields at the Great North Run. While conditions changed dramatically in the afternoon, the majority of those who took part did so in very warm temperatures, with the sun beating down on the roads that they pounded along. There were 33 Harriers in action on the day. First over the line was Chris Lines in 1:29:33, followed by Colin Gandy in 1:30:44 and debutant Sadie Abel was the first female Harrier in 1:37:59. Another making their debut was junior Harrier Rory Letts, who finished in an impressive 1:42:57. Harrier John Tomlinson is one of the small number of people who has completed every single Great North Run, while Ean Parsons has run all but one of the 42 events.

There were also numerous other runners from Sedgefield taking part, including many who were raising money for good causes, while a big group of Harriers were on duty as volunteers, handing out medals to finishers in South Shields. Well done to everyone who took part, or helped out, or was there to offer support – all of you help make the Great North Run such a special occasion.


Cricket

The 2023 cricket season will be remembered as one of the wettest ever, but after the sun shone during the final weeks, Sedgefield Cricket Club can look proudly back at its achievements.

A fourth place finish in Division 1 plus a cup win marked a solid season for the 1st XI, while the 2nd XI consolidated last year's promotion with a top half finish in Division 3. Also finishing high up were the 3rd XI, and the 4th XI (the Winkers) won both their league and awards for contributions to the hospitality industry.

The 2023/24 squash season is now underway, so it's all systems go at Sedgefield Squash Club.

September marks the conclusion of the Summer Squash Ladder competition, which has again been hugely successful in keeping the courts busy over the summer. A total of 567 matches were played by 43 club members. Prizes will be awarded at the presentation night for the most number of games played, the most points scored, and the highest percentage of wins based on the number of games played. The club has announced the launch of its new junior membership and coaching packages. The junior committee was disbanded at the end of 2022, and this presented opportunities to review the offer, in the context of the club having an objective to be a Centre of Excellence for squash in County Durham. With that in mind, Sedgefield Squash Club is offering its junior members greater opportunities to play squash on days other than a Saturday, to be able to go into the club whenever they are able, to book court time with their friends, and improve their game and match play, all with a view to them playing as adults in the various leagues and competitions.



Alongside this activity, the club will be running the Squash Stars programmes where kids take part in a six-week introduction package organised by governing body, England Squash. Sedgefield has entered teams in the Durham & Cleveland County Leagues due to start at the end of September. The county has restructured the leagues this year, resulting in more matches to be played by each team, so it will be a busy season ahead.
