Ford Castle


Earlier this term, all of our Y7 students had the opportunity to take part in a residential visit to Ford Castle near Berwick-Upon-Tweed. This is an outward-bound centre and is the fifth year that we have offered an experience of this kind as part of our transition programme and the first where we have used this new venue. Ford Castle was a wonderful base for the week and all of the students who attended can now say that they have slept in a castle! During the course of the visit, the children were able to take part in a wide range of activities and these included zip wire, vertical challenge and laser tag. The attitude that the students demonstrated throughout their stay was superb. As they faced each new challenge, they were able to develop many of the key skills that we prioritise in school and most notably the ability to 'Stay Positive', 'Leadership' and 'Teamwork'. Well done to all of our students and a huge thank you to the staff who supervised the visit and made sure the children had an experience that they will never forget!



The visit was provided free of charge to our students thanks to additional charitable funding that is provided to the school through the Laidlaw Foundation. Over the course of the year, a range of additional experiences relating to areas such as the creative arts and STEM workshops will be made available to our students as a consequence of this generous support.

We were delighted that over 80 members and visitors packed the Parish Hall early in the month to listen to Mark Braithwaite's talk on John Darwin, the Canoe Man from Seaton Carew. Mark began by reprising his previous talk on the Julie Hogg murder case and the subsequent repeal of the Double Jeopardy Law. He also informed us that Anne Ming, Julie's mother, is in talks with people in both Australia and the USA to try to remove the Double Jeopardy Laws in place there.

Mark gave a detailed insight into the John and Anne Darwin case and their trial and imprisonment for Fraud. Strange though it seemed at the time, John was given a lesser sentence because he pleaded 'guilty'. Despite her defence of the direct coercion of her husband, Anne's sentence was because she was the one who had actually made all the claims for the insurance monies etc. – approx £500,000. We were pleased to hear that all but a few thousand pounds were recovered and repaid.

Mid-month, the Theatre Group visited The Theatre Royal in Newcastle to see a production of Miss Saigon. Some great performances - the Engineer stood out - a spectacular helicopter ascent, and a very emotional final scene; I don't usually leave a theatre in tears! Our next visit is to the pantomime at Darlington Hippodrome in December. Oh yes it is!

On 22 October, our Science and Industry Group went Stargazing in Weardale. Despite a cold and dreary start to the journey, there must have been intervention from on high because on arrival at Stanhope the skies cleared and arrival on site after a short train journey heralded clear, sharp conditions to view the heavens, either by eye or through one of the many telescopes provided by the Bishop Auckland Astronomy Society. STEVE'S NATURE DIARY DECEMBER 2025

There have been quite a few photographs on social media recently, accompanied by lots of excitement. Why? Well, the otters at the Tees Barrage have been putting on a show. Having never seen an otter in the Tees Valley I had to make a visit, so one Wednesday I planned to pop in and try my luck. I was standing (if you know the barrage site) just by the fish pass and there were around a dozen people there. Suddenly, to my left, I heard a murmur of excitement. We all looked over the barriers, and there it was - a rather large otter moving its way along the edge of the river. Before we knew it, and before I had the chance to get my camera out, it was out onto the path and crossing over into the white-water site. We all managed to follow it - seeing it swim under water as it made its way back to the river. What an experience - I was over the moon - my first otter sighting in the Tees Valley. I remember the story of how, a few years ago elsewhere in the North East, an Otter Project Officer was in post for at least two years before they saw an otter - they did their surveys by looking for otter spraint (droppings) and rarely encountered a live otter. Otters almost disappeared in the mid-20th century due to hunting, pesticides (like DDT), and poor water quality. They survived mainly in Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland. The River Tees, once heavily polluted during the industrial era, now supports salmon, seals, eels, and otters thanks to major conservation and water quality improvements.

How things have changed; otters can now be found in every county in England. Over the past few years, the number of reports of otter have increased in the Tees Valley including those at the barrage and Portrack Marsh, especially if you get up early to try and spot them. As apex predators, otters help regulate fish populations and indicate healthy waterways. Their return reflects the broader ecological recovery of the Tees Valley. However,



with an increased number of visitors looking for otters especially at the barrage, people need to consider that these animals are wild animals and need to remember to give them space, not to chase them and very importantly keep their dogs on a lead. Even well-behaved dogs may react differently when confronted with an otter; this is both for the safety of the otter and the dog as otters can be aggressive especially when they have young to protect. As well as the dangers of human disturbance, otters also have to contend with new and varied threats, including habitat destruction (road building, new urban developments), persecution by fishery owners and gamekeepers (as they are seen as a threat to fish and game birds, which is untrue), and if near the sea, injury and capture in fishing nets. Changes in traditional farming methods also play a part in threatening the otter via the increased use of pesticides. So, there is still a need for vigilance but with continued conservation efforts, monitoring, and public awareness hopefully the future of this remarkable animal will be secure in the Tees Valley.



SPORTS UPDATE with Chris Lines

Last month, I promised all sorts of updates this time around. However, once again, I've received loads of news from different sources, so the best laid plans have somewhat gone to pot. It's a nice problem and demonstrates how vibrant the grass roots sports scene is in our community. I will definitely cover everything that I said I would, but some of it will come in future updates.

Cricket

With The Ashes now in full swing over in Australia, and in spite of the huge rivalry, it's fair to say that Sedgefield Cricket Club's links with the land down under go back a good few years. Back in 1993, Sedgefield began the season in the Durham County League with the 1st XI including a young Australian in the ranks. Richie Power from Perth was a hugely popular figure at the club that year, and played a big part in the team winning the league for the first (and only) time.

So, it was a wonderful reunion in late October when Richie returned to Sedgefield for the first time in 32 years. A tour of many of the opponents' grounds revealed Richie's fond - and at times photographic - memories of the matches he played, and many former players met up both at the club and in the village to reminisce over a beer or two. With a promise not to leave it so long before returning once more, Richie headed off home with plenty of laughs and stories recalled and shared.

The cricket links between Sedgefield and Australia remain strong today. This year, the club welcomed Aussie Hayden Wrigglesworth to its ranks for the season, and as I type this, three lads from Sedgefield are playing in Australia – Ben Swindale, William Hampson and former club member Freddie Lower.

As he is on the other side of the world, Ben wasn't there in person at the North Yorkshire and South Durham Cricket Awards, to accept the Division 1 batting award. It was a great night for Sedgefield, with two other winners – George Hampson, who won the Sunday Conference North bowling award, and Ollie Johnson, who won both the Sunday Conference North batting and junior batting awards.

Squash

Sedgefield's 1st team have reached the quarter finals of the County League Cup and are the club's only remaining team left in this competition. Matches will recommence in the New Year. For the first time in the club's history, Sedgefield has two teams in the top Division. While this is a real challenge for the 2nd team, they are holding their own against some strong opposition.

Sedgefield 1st team, last year's runners up in the Durham & Cleveland Leagues, have had a slow start due to injuries and Newcastle United's participation in the Champions League. The 3rd team, promoted last year into Division 2, are also going to have a challenging season and are currently sitting eighth out of nine teams. The 4th team was promoted last year into Division 3 and have made strong start with four wins out of four, currently sitting second in their division with a game in hand. The 5th team are sitting comfortably mid table in Division 4, with some strong performances right across the squad. Sedgefield's ladies' team have only played two matches. They are still without a win, but there are plenty of fixtures left to play.

The club's 10 internal leagues have been well supported by members, proving very popular for players of all standards, and providing the means to meet new people while keeping fit and having fun.

Club members past and present, together with their friends and families, are welcome to gather in the Herd & Herb bar on Saturday 6 December from 6:30pm onwards for drinks, food and music, to celebrate the up-and-coming festive season together. Wishing all the best for Christmas to everyone.

Athletics

Senior and junior members of Sedgefield Harriers have been extremely busy on the roads and in cross country races recently. In late October, Justin Cox and Lisa Darby wore the England vest in their age groups at the Abingdon Marathon in Oxfordshire, while Jane Spink did likewise at the Paris 10K. Jane. Lisa and clubmate David Bentley have also qualified to compete in the Masters Marathon World Championships in Cape Town 2026. A couple of weeks later, Jane and Lisa celebrated by taking on the New York Marathon. Meanwhile, Sadie Abel broke her own club 10K record at the Jarrow 10K, with a time of 39 minutes and 13 seconds. These achievements represent just a snapshot of numerous excellent performances.






