Sedgefield Town Council's Meetings are open to all our residents. We meet on the 2nd Monday of each month (except August) for our monthly meeting and also our Policy and Resources Committee, whilst on the 3rd Monday our Community Development and Environment Committees take place. We begin at 7pm in the Council Offices.

All agendas now include an item called Public Participation and whilst these are not question and answer sessions or a debating time, they do provide an ideal opportunity for you to make your views known to Council members or to bring forward new ideas which you would like members to discuss.

If possible the Chair will give an immediate answer if he or she is able to, but the council cannot take a decision as such at that time. If the item is already on the agenda then discussion on the matter and possibly a resolution will take place at that point in the meeting. (In accordance with our Standing Orders – no decision can be taken without prior notification on an agenda.)

It is more probable that your comments will be noted and passed onto the relevant committee who will then discuss the matter and make the relevant recommendations to full Council.

A postcard from the past

Perhaps you remember Victor Dodds, who married local girl, Freda Davison, who was the first hairdresser to set up business in Sedgefield.

June photograph

Nancy Wells tells us that the June photograph of the ladies group has already appeared in Sedgefield News, as she loaned it last year. However, it may well spark a few more memories. It is not the Women's Institute, but the Women's Guild started by Canon Wykes, whose wife was president. Subsequent rectors carried on the tradition until Canon Edmundson, who thought the Guild should amalgamate with the Mother's Union. Nancy, who joined when she and Keith moved to Sedgefield in 1954, still has a copy of her membership card. Started for young wives, the guild met in the old Church Hall, now Turners showroom and workshop in Rectory Row. They met fortnightly, taking turns to go along in pairs to light the old fashioned boiler to warm the room. Each quarter of the year they had a Church service, with readings by members, closing at 9.30 pm with a prayer from the Rector. For gift days, each member baked, taking their produce to Betty Ducker's house near the Parish Hall. The next day, the home baked cakes were taken to the hall and always sold out, making a good profit. Nancy remembers the names of many ladies on the photograph. Maybe readers could fill in the gaps.

1st Sedgefield Guides & Brownies change venue

Regrettably, as from September 1st, Sedgefield Guides & Brownies will no longer hold their weekly meetings in Sedgefield Primary School.

Sedgefield Village Neighbourhood & Crime Watch Panel Notes from the Meeting held on 11th June 2013

The imminent retirement of our Sergeant, Brian O'Connor was announced to the meeting; after 30 years' service Brian is to tackle pastures new. Members of N/Hood Watch extended their thanks and appreciation for all that Brian has done for the village, much unseen and unheard. C/man Ken Saiger on behalf of N/Hood Watch extends his thanks and wishes Brian every success in the future.

Outstanding issues from April are Speeding and Car Parking problems in the village and commercial vehicle parking in a residential estate. Also traffic dangers for pedestrians following Sainsbury's opening; Winterton petition has full support from Town Council. No response from DCC to petitioners) yet.

Durham Police are targeting cannabis cultivation: predominantly found to be persons new to the area, often in residential properties. Neil Langthorne asked members and the public to really keep their eyes open for anything suspicious (closed/ obstructed windows, condensation inside, house shut up regularly, any unusual aromas around a property & newcomers in such surroundings) and to report observations to the Police ASAP (use 101).

Mark Pheasant (Crime Prevention) is to return to Beat duties as the post of Crime Prevention Officer is now a civilian appointment. Mark sent his apologies for being unable to inform members in person. His replacement is Duncan Gill.

Village Parking. Neil & Keith advised that this is now a Durham County Council managed matter and so all concerns / reports of issues should from now on be made to DCC 's **The Parking Shop**. Please telephone direct: **0191 3846633**.

If you want action on a parking matter, even a Zebra Crossing issue, ring this number; they are empowered to issue fines directly!

Local Crime Report from PC Keith Todd showed an **increase** in crime & ASB in the last two months. From 17/04/2013 - 10/04/2013 there were 274 (previously129) calls made to the Police, 24(previously 5) were of ASB; 86 (previously 52) were traffic related and 14 (previously 9) were actual Crimes (5 thefts, 6 Burglary & 3 of Criminal Damage/fire). An unwelcome change!

Keith re-emphasised the need for the public to report all and any observations / concerns to the Police, it is the best way of catching criminals and also preventing crime! If you are unsure of vehicles, get the registration number and phone it in. This is invaluable intelligence in knowing what thieves are up to and Keith gave a detailed example in relation to recent burglaries in Winterton estate; so please do ring 101.

ATM Credit Card (details &) Money Thefts using CO-OP & Barclays machines this month. Please note - this is the second time this year villagers have been robbed this way! Advice for users to prevent PIN numbers being seen (& then used) is to ensure you obscure *entirely* the key pad and your hand whilst entering the PIN number, simply by using a purse or similar object over the top of that hand. Neil Langthorne gave a simple demonstration to members.

Anti-Social Behaviour: new issues raised. 1. Winterton estate – again no reports made to the agencies (DCC/Police). 2. Very abusive behaviour from Community College pupils particularly on a Garnett's school bus to our "lollipop lady", including throwing objects off the bus! School has been informed as well as her employer but Keith was asked to assist, which he agreed to do.

3. Speeding cars on Hardwick Park Estate. Keith asked for car reg details and reports to be made as these occur.

There was no scheduled meeting for June, but remember the Neighbourhood Watch meeting is always held the month that there is no Forum and everyone is welcome at the Watch/Crime Prevention meeting. As the Forum meeting scheduled for May 13th was adjourned so that residents could attend the first meeting of the new Town Council we will catch up on issues from the March meeting minutes at the July meeting.

Our new Town Councillors are 'getting to grips' with their new roles and are doing a great job looking at issues which have been ongoing and new issues raised. Chris Lines is doing an excellent job as Chair and the Council have selected Mel Carr to be Mayor for this year, I'm sure Mel will do an excellent job representing our community.

As we have reported before there will be further consultations coming up on housing development in the village so watch out for dates and do try to attend. It is noticeable in the local press that many communities in the County are having to take action to protect the areas they value; our amenities and infrastructure are at serious risk with the building proposals for Sedgefield. On a brighter note, it is great to see all our schools in the village doing so well. Ofsted reports have been great and Hardwick School are going to look fantastic in their new uniforms with updated modern branding.

The next Forum meeting is at 7pm on Monday 1st July in the Fletcher Room of the Parish Hall. Everyone is welcome so why not come along to hear what is going on and if you wish give your views or raise any issues.

A slight rise in crime reported to Police. Garages in Millclose Walk, Turnpike Walk and Winterton Avenue all became targets. Items taken include a set of golf clubs, mountain bike, hand tools and alcohol. We still have not identified the owner of a set of golf clubs abandoned nearby. Other crimes include windows broken in the old Winterton church, damage to a vehicle in Eden Drive, theft of a spare wheel in The Meadows, theft of a vehicle in Cunningham Court and theft of diesel from commercial vehicles on the industrial estate. I also want to warn residents to be very careful when they use either of the cashpoint machines in Sedgefield. One unsuspecting female resident became the victim of a criminal gang recently after they placed a reading device over the card insert slot on the cashpoint machine. The device including a hidden camera was able to read her pin number when she entered the number without covering her actions. Moments later she became concerned that the machine had swallowed her card and not released money, so she went into the co-op to report the fault. This gave the criminals enough time to recover the device, download the information onto another card which they then used at the Barclavs bank cashpoint to withdraw £1,000. All this within 15 minutes! CCTV has been recovered showing two males committing this crime. They are described as of Eastern European appearance. This is the second time in recent months this type of crime has been committed at the same cashpoints. These people are travelling criminals and must use a vehicle so if you see any suspicious persons take a few moments to make a mental note of the registration number or report it to police. Your information may prove vital in apprehending this gang.

Pub Watch A meeting was held recently in the Crosshills. No reports were made that required further action from members.

P.A.C.T. At a meeting held after Neighbourhood Watch the new priority was discussed. Members decided it would be prudent to continue to target inconsiderate drivers using Durham Road as a race track. The speed limit is 30mph. Don't be one of a growing number of drivers being sent warning letters regarding speeding. You have been warned. Until next time.





By the time you read this, the British and Irish Lions will have played at least one test against Australia, the second week of Wimbledon will be starting, Team GB will have competed in the European Team Championships in Gateshead, the Tour de France will be underway and it will be only days until the start of the Ashes, with the Open Golf Championship also on the near horizon; safe to say that we're in the middle of another very busy summer of sport. There's plenty of in that list to keep couch potatoes glued to TV, but summer is also the perfect time to get out and try some sport, and in Sedgefield we are blessed with loads of opportunities to do that. This time last year, we were in the middle of Sedgefield Village Games, inspired by the London 2012 Olympics and Paralympics and the 700th anniversary of Sedgefield being granted its market charter. Over three weeks, hundreds of young people and adults participated in free sporting events in the village – a great community initiative made possible by the volunteering efforts of many individuals, clubs and societies. Towards the end of last year, the Sedgefield Village Games organising committee met and decided that it would be a real shame if the initiative simply disappeared after 2012. The committee has been working hard to develop a plan for the future of the Sedgefield Village Games and all will be revealed very soon – hopefully in the next issue of Sedgefield News, so watch this space!

Rugby Union

Last season saw a mixture of highs and lows for Sedgefield District RFC. Injuries hit the club hard, and for long parts of the campaign, the team took to the pitch without key players. This made for challenging and often frustrating times for players and spectators alike.

However, with some strong winning performances, and narrow defeats, Sedgefield showed more and more that they are a force to be reckoned with, especially at home, which became the proverbial fortress. A final league position of sixth was one place lower than the previous year, but this also highlighted the improvements that other teams had made. Moving forward, the club hopes to secure financial support to carry out much needed work on its pitch, as they look to strengthen their ties with the cricket club, whose support has always been fantastic.

The club continues to focus on participation and is constantly looking for players of any ability and fitness. Look out for more news of how to get involved soon. Pre-season training has already started, on Thursday evenings at Winterton Fields (between the housing and NETPark) - all are welcome.

Junior Athletics

The outdoor track and field season is in full swing, with half of the various fixtures now completed. Junior Sedgefield Harriers from Year 3 right up to Year 12 have been competing in various competitions in the North East and beyond. In the Wednesday night Monkton Grand Prix series 16 athletes have taken part, with half of them currently lying in trophy positions. Sedgefield athletes top both the U17 women and U15 girls categories, with second places in both categories too, as well as in the U15 boys, U13 girls and U13 boys. U13 boy Robbie Till deserves a particular mention – Robbie has competed in every meeting so far, making his high jump, long jump and javelin debuts in the Grand Prix series and doing so well that he is currently in the top three in his age group.

Even more athletes, 30 or so, have been representing Sedgefield in the new (Sunday) North East Youth Development League with two of the four meetings now completed. Sedgefield sit in third place in this divisional league at the half -way stage. Many athletes have competed for the first time outside of school and the club is grateful to all of them and their families for supporting Sedgefield's first season in this league. One of the many highlights so far is Josh Hetherington's shot put win at U15 boys level, with a throw that has put him high up in the UK athletics rankings.

Over 30 primary age children have also been competing at Gateshead Stadium on Sundays in the Youth Athletes League (YAL), which is based on a Quadkids format of run, jump and throw. Again, there have been many fine performances in this Grand Prix series where medals are also given on the day. Sedgefield athletes have scored plenty of points, won a lot of medals in the two meetings, and a number of our athletes are in contention for a Grand Prix trophy. By the time the next YAL meeting takes place the athletes in this league will have run on the same track and jumped in the same long jump pits as Mo Farah and Greg Rutherford respectively, two of the Team GB gold medal winners from London 2012's 'Super Saturday', who both competed in the European Team Championships in Gateshead.

Finally, Sedgefield athletes have also turned out in the North Yorkshire & South Durham (Tuesday night) League, again putting in many great performances as well as appearing at a number of open medal meetings. Well done to all of the above athletes, and to their families and friends for providing transport and support!

Athletics

With spring marathon season over, running the far flung trails past Coxhoe & Hett or Thorpe Thewles & Hurworth Burn, is a fading memory until next year. Results were mixed, some exceeding targets by a long way, others finding out what the last few miles of a marathon are all about.

Ean Parsons' experience at Boston was the curtain raiser and (bombs aside) Ean didn't do badly, surviving the infamous Heartbreak Hill and finishing in 3:33. 'The London' was next, with Matthew Jones' fantastic personal best of 3:16 the pick of the bunch from six Harriers, including Clair Budd fulfilling a lifetime ambition to be there. Next was the Marathon of the North and that short course, 26.2 miles turning out to be a mere 26. 5 Harriers fell foul of the marshalling, but the biggest disappointment was for Steve Foreman who had taken well over half an hour off his PB to finish sub 3:30, only to find that his result was invalid. Ellen Tipple and Ean Parsons took on the inaugural Scafell Pike Marathon, from Keswick, over England's highest peak and back to the Lakeland town. Try the weekend of the Edinburgh Marathon for a warm Scottish holiday. Harriers Suzanne Tait, Tommy Dunn & Daniel Probert suffered in the heat!

Finally, Two other Harriers deserve a mention; Gary Thwaites, on his quest to complete as many marathons as he can (7 so far this year, including Druridge Bay, London & Howgill; and Paul Weir,

pictured, going from strength to strength in 10k. Paul started to compete relatively recently but is now often the first Harrier home. He seems to achieve PBs every week and not long ago, he brought his 10k PB down to an outstanding 36:44 at the Clive Cookson 10k in North Shields. Sport continues on p.11
