Yet again it's OFSTED success for Sedgefield

Sedgefield Primary School had a very successful Ofsted Inspection just before Easter, when it was rated as a **Good school**, where children make 'good and sometimes outstanding progress to reach well above average standards', ensuring that 'by the time they leave the school, they are confident, articulate young people, well prepared for the next stage in their education'.

The inspectors were impressed by the children's **exemplary behaviour**, as well as their pride in their school. Inspectors found 'Pupils are caring, exceptionally courteous and treat others, whether friends or adults, as they themselves would wish to be treated. Parents are overwhelmingly positive about the quality of care their children receive so that they are happy, safe and free from bullying. This allows pupils to focus fully on their learning, make at least good progress and develop exemplary attitudes to all that they experience at school.'

The inspectors noted the positive impact of the recent improvements to the school environment and were particularly complimentary about the achievements made in writing, as this has been an area of focus for the last two years and the school has been very successful in raising standards.

The final report is word-limited, so not all elements discussed with the inspectors were included in the final report. These include comments such as the children having a 'determination to succeed'; and the school having a 'strong focus on developing independent learning'.

They felt the school has a 'strong sense of community' and a particularly 'family feel' and 'caring ethos'. Headteacher Andrea Cox has always said that the children are the best thing about the school... "The inspectors agreed! They really enjoyed spending time with our fabulous children. I am delighted that the hard work of our staff team was recognised and that much of the teaching was rated as outstanding. The inspectors also commented upon the excellent support provided by our Governors. Our children deserve the best and we have worked very hard in the last few years to ensure that they all learn, achieve and have fun at our school and we will continue to do so."

Sedgefield Village Neighbourhood & Crime Watch Panel Notes from Meeting held on 16th April 2013

When discussing the major reduction in actual crime and anti-social behaviour, Community Liaison Officer Neil Langthorne pointed out that these reductions would not have been achieved without the input and support provided to the Police by members of groups like Sedgefield Neighbourhood Watch along with those members of the public who also took the time and made the effort to contact the Police. He asked members in Sedgefield to keep up their efforts.

The **Local Crime Report** from PC Keith Todd served to confirm Neil's report of lower crime. From 13/02/2013 - 16/04/2013, 129 calls were made to Police, 5 of ASB, 52 traffic related and 9 actual Crimes (7 thefts, 1 Burglary & 1 Criminal Damage/fire). Significantly lower than last year!

A member of the public reported to Keith Todd that he had been almost knocked down 3 times recently due to speeding/dangerous drivers on Durham road and provided Keith with details.

Generally everyone felt that there is *still* an on-going problem with speeding and inconsiderate drivers in Sedgefield, with Durham Road being highlighted more than other areas.

Members felt that more traffic problems will occur once Sainsbury opens (in Salters Lane) everyone was concerned and Keith acknowledged the problem potential. Following on from the Sainsbury opening discussion, Alan Greener's petition for road crossings for Winterton Estate residents was explained (crossing of the B1278 and also across Salters Lane itself) and discussed. The proposal was given support by persons present at the meeting.

Other traffic / vehicle matters raised were:

Unsafe Parking: Specifically Spring Lane & Stockton Road nr Golden Lion. **HGV Traffic:** Now being allowed access down Spring Lane.

Nuisance Parking: A Turners commercial vehicle regularly parks in a residential area close to houses (Belsay/Matfen Court area). Keith agreed to contact Turners with a view to obtaining better consideration for residents from them/their driver.

Post Meeting, Chairman Ken Saiger, on behalf of N/H/Watch extended his sincere thanks to Mayor John Robinson for the much appreciated donation he has made from his charitable funds; the money will enable the group to continue to hire a room for our meetings.

Ron Hogg slams 'privatising services' speech

Durham's Police and Crime Commissioner has spoken out against comments made by recently appointed Chief Inspector of Constabulary, Tom Winsor, who called for greater collaboration in policing as well as improvements in technology and more extensive use of private sector organisations to deliver services. Mr Hogg believes Mr Winsor's insistence on the need for forces to privatise services in order to save money is misguided and that "Partnership work provides the synergy to tackle the causes of crime and anti-social behaviour across a broad front and making best use of resources."

"Like collaboration, it is something we have done for many years and we will continue to exploit new avenues. Policing is not just about crime prevention as Mr Winsor suggests. Detecting crime and dealing with the aftermath is equally important and we continue to put victims at the forefront of the services we deliver. Even though crime is continuing to fall, I am determined that the force will maintain and improve its performance in ensuring that County Durham and Darlington remain among the safest places to live and work."

Residents' Forum Jottings from May 2013

The May monthly meeting was deferred a week because of the bank holiday to

May 13th. As this was the first meeting of the newly elected Councillors following the Town and County elections on May 2nd and several residents attending the Forum were very keen to attend the Council meeting, the Forum meeting was abandoned so that we could all be present at the first Town Council meeting and show support for the newly elected Councillors.

Our community had one of the highest turnouts in the County for the elections and residents clearly voted for change by electing all the independent candidates who stood. These new Councillors have made a commitment to listen to the communities wishes and act in their best interests, so the 'ball is now in the court' of the community; we must let the Town Council know what we want to see happen.

In the summer there will be further consultation on proposed housing developments in the village. We continually hear people saying Sedgefield cannot accommodate the number of new homes proposed but it needs residents to attend consultation events and let their views be known – so watch out for consultation events being held and try to get along. The proposed developments will affect everyone in the village who uses schools, doctors, parking etc.

The Forum has asked to meet the new Town Council at their convenience so that we can have joint discussion on how best to operate the Forum for the benefit of all and the Forum looks forward to a positive working partnership with the Council for the benefit of all residents.





Sedgefield in Bloom

The development of Wykes Close wildflower garden received a major boost in April when Betty Amlin planted a maple tree in memory of Canadian airmen lost in a wartime crash in Sedgefield. The sterling efforts of Betty and her late husband Jimmy led to the creation in 1994 of a lasting memorial to Jim's fellow Canadians alongside the cenotaph in front of St Edmund's church.

The Amlins lived close to the Wykes Close garden for many years, their house unmistakeable with its red maple leaf. The Sedgefield in Bloom team, in collaboration with livin housing providers, who own the land, have been working hard to transform a plain grassed area into a wildflower meadow. Overgrown ivy has been stripped from the old rectory wall, where perennial and annual plants now give a splash of colour. The large area of currently bare soil has been treated and prepared for the planting of wildflower plugs, carefully selected to suit the different conditions, very boggy at one end, much drier at the other.
