A chance to vote for investment in this community

We all have ideas about how public money should be spent in Sedgefield and this month you have the chance to decide where some investment is made. A scheme called "It's Up 2 U" is offering grants of up to £4,000 to community projects in parts of County Durham. In total, £80,000 is available and applications by several groups from Sedgefield have been shortlisted to receive grants, along with many others from the county. Decisions about which projects get what money will be made based on a public vote taking place at Sedgefield Community College, on Saturday 23rd November between 10am and 2pm. Every shortlisted project will have the opportunity to showcase how they will use the money and how it will benefit the community. Members of the public, children and adults, can select those they think most deserving. There will also be fun activities and demonstrations throughout the day - face painting, dancing, a brass band, along with information stalls. At the same time you can vote on the Area Action Partnership priorities for next year and take part in the County Council Budget Consultation to shape where savings are made in the County. Communities from throughout the county will bring people who will vote for projects in their areas, so if you want Sedgefield based initiatives to receive grants, it is important that you turn up, find out more and cast your votes.

Sedgefield in Bloom

Sedgefield carried off gold once again at the Britain in Bloom awards on Saturday October 12th in wet and windy Cleethorpes. Organic gardener Bob Flowerdew, the pigtailed presenter on Gardeners' World and Gardeners' Question Time, handed out awards in front of a packed audience from all parts of the country. Although Sedgefield was pipped to Best Small Town by Ahoghill in Northern Ireland, we scored gold in every category of the mark scheme, which covers horticultural achievement, environmental responsibility and community participation. At the follow-up meeting the judges had little to criticise, but did comment on weeds in the cobbles in front of the church and felt that one or two local businesses could give more visible support to the Bloom efforts. This follows the Northumbria in Bloom awards where Sedgefield took gold and Best Small Town in Northumbria for the sixth time in succession, and, with a massive score of 99%, the Golden Lion won gold and Best Pub in Northumbria. When it came to the Percy Boydell Award for Best Overall entry, we were stunned to hear presenter Marion Foster say 'Stand up Sedgefield!' We gained a total of 98%, with full marks for environmental responsibility and community involvement. Chairman Howard Smith holding the beautiful Georgian silver trophy said,' After years of playing football with no success, I now know how it feels to lift the FA cup.' The entire Bloom team, professional gardeners Stephen and Roy, the town council and its staff, sponsors, supporters, school children and all sorts of Sedgefield organisations came together to prove what a blooming great place we live, work and play in. Well done us!




Sedgefield Neighbourhood Plan

The Designation is made under the following parts of the Planning Act:

The Development and Growth of Sedgefield:

An opportunity to influence planning decisions and economic development

You may be aware that the Government has decided to enable the building of more houses and economic infrastructure, through legislation that is designed to encourage developers to invest in and around communities such as Sedgefield. In response to this, Durham County Council is in the process of producing a county wide plan that will potentially give the green light for the construction of an additional 470 homes in Sedgefield.

The same national planning legislation also gives communities the right to develop what are called 'Neighbourhood Plans' which, once completed, become legally binding documents that must be taken into account in the planning process. These plans focus on land use and have to accept the overall developments outlined in the county wide plans, but can influence key details (e.g. the type and spread of housing). Instigated by the town council, Sedgefield has resolved to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for the area within its parish boundary.

The Sedgefield Plan will be developed by a steering group made up of people who together aim to represent the whole community. During its first full meeting, I was asked to chair that group and we have started to assemble a team to get the programme underway. Together, we have defined four topic areas that will be included in our Neighbourhood Plan - they are Housing, Local Economy, Community and Environment, and Infrastructure. Each of these groups is to be led by an independent local resident and they are tasked with the job of gathering evidence, facts, opinions and statistics that will inform the writing and publication of our final plan.

However, to achieve our goal we need to gather your views and opinions/contributions and before we can publish we need to carry out a referendum to ensure that the plan is supported by the majority of residents.

This is a very big project that has the potential to establish a clear community view of how Sedgefield should develop. We will have more homes, but what type and where should they be built? Can our current infrastructure support development and if not, what needs to be done to improve it? Can the schools and doctors cope? And what about jobs, community facilities and youth provision? These are some of the major challenges that face Sedgefield in the future and the Neighbourhood Plan is our opportunity to influence and shape our community over the next few decades.

Please get involved. We need people with expertise and interest to join the topic teams, and we need people to contribute their views through the website that will be live soon, and in other ways. In short, we are determined to make this process as inclusive as possible. We have a lot of ideas about how to gather opinion and general input from throughout the

community, so one way or another you will be hearing from us soon. When you do, please respond. Ultimately, the Sedgefield Plan will belong to you and we really need you to be part of its development.

Sedgefield Village Neighbourhood & Crime Watch Panel

On Tuesday October 8th the N/H/Watch AGM & normal Panel meetings took place. Despite darker evenings, attendance was at a good level and a beneficial meeting ensued. Relevant information and views from the meeting follows. Durham Police now employ only 4 Crime Prevention Officers (no longer Police Officers) across the County.

13,000 householders in Durham are now registered to receive Police updates and information via the "Voice Connect System".

Crime appears to be on the rise & in Sedgefield it seems to be Shoplifting, Shed Burglary & Thefts.

Anti-Social Behaviour is increasing. Local Police are aware and are targeting two problem areas in the village.

The Town Council does not support an Alcohol Free Zone in Sedgefield, nor do the Police.

Members do not accept Pub Watch scheme is totally effective; nor does the Town Council.

Speeding and pedestrian difficulties in crossing roads in Sedgefield is still a severe problem. No authoritative body appears to accept or is willing to take any real measures to alleviate the problem.

Sedgefield residents must be content with all of the above, as almost no-one turned out to the Police Crime Commissioner Ron Hogg's meeting in Sedgefield in September.

Protect your home, get those light timers out again and set them to keep your property looking occupied even with curtains drawn.

Recent crimes included several that involved goods on show, unlocked vehicles & poor safety measures by households.

Sedgefield Residents' Forum Jottings

No scheduled meeting for October so just a couple of updates: As reported last month, both County Councillors had agreed to take 3 of our issues back to County for clarification and further comment. We still await updates.

The Hardwick Live event seems to have been a great success but many residents were considerably disturbed by noise and indeed the Oyster Fest caused some problems. It seems to be one those acoustic anomalies that the sound away from the event is actually louder than at the event. Obviously this will need further consideration as there will surely be further Licensing applications for repeat events.

If you care about the community you live in it is again time to take action and give your views on what you want to happen to our village.

There is now a steering group to formulate our village plan and it is essential that you give your view. More on page 3. It's also essential to give your views on the latest County Durham Plan and what DCC say should happen here. You will have an opportunity on 6th November from 4- 8pm in Ceddesfeld Hall where DCC will have information available and officers on hand to answer questions. On November 23rd 10am-2pm at Sedgefield Community College you can comment on DCC budget plans and identify where *you* think financial cuts should be made! And at this event you can vote for which community organisations should get some funding; several village organisations have submitted applications so please give them your support.



Stem cell donor fundraising for Anthony Nolan

I was recently contacted by Anthony Nolan to say that I was a match for a patient in need of a stem cell transplant. I initially joined the register 7-8 years ago as my friend's little sister was ill and in need of a donor. During that time Anthony Nolan has contacted me on 4 separate occasions about being a potential match for someone. There was more urgency about their contact this time so I knew I must have been a very good match.

After further blood tests and a medical, I was passed fit to donate. In the 4 days before the donation I was given 4 injections to encourage the stem cells to move from the bone marrow into the bloodstream ready for collection. So came the day of donation. The usual method is via each arm but during the medical the nurses couldn't identify a strong enough vein in either arm so they decided to put a central line into a larger vein at the top of my right leg. Once this was done I was hooked up to the machine that takes the stem cells needed for the transplant for just over 5 hours.

Later that day the transplant centre phoned with the results and the nurse informed me they had managed to take over double the requested amount. I really hope this has helped the recipient.
